Adults will be led by Delores Thomas, current president of WMU of NC and an administrative assistant at Wingate University and will meet in the fellowship hall; youth in their usual area; GAs and RAs will be combined for their study; 4 and 5 years old Mission Friends will meet in their usual meeting room with Gina Nash and Alyce Quinn; and children 3 years and under will have childcare provided in the nursery area.
