Romans 6:8-14

SIGNIFICANCE OF DEATH

In verses 8-10, Paul drew a few theological conclusions for us...

Christ died for us and we died with Him.

In His death, Christ defeated death.

Christ died to sin.

The life of Christ becomes our model for living.

Paul gave us two forms of assurance...we believe (8) and we know (9)...

MAKE YOUR LIFE COUNT

Verse 11...we have two commands...

The word “count” in verse 11 is important. It comes from a Greek word...

What does all of this counting have to do with verse 11 and sin and God?

God has not added salvation to you. He has transformed you.

Satan does not want you to believe this reality.

A continued battle with sin does not contradict this truth.

The righteousness of Christ is draped over us.

What applications can we carry away from the truth of verse 11?

Confidence in the midst of temptation

We cannot sin our way out of God’s grace.

Confidence in the face of death.

God can use these things.

MAKE THE RIGHT OFFERING

In verses 12-14, Paul made His closing argument.

Paul said that for the Christian, sin is...

that, but believers are continually tempted to put the old clothes

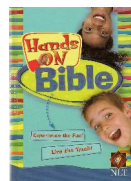
back on. It is that continuing battle with sin and Satan that
